# 13. Ordinance by the Locust Grove city council to call a special election to fill the vacancy in the office of Locust Grove Mayor –

Andy stepped forward and said this is to fill the vacancy of the seat of the late Mayor Robert Price and reviewed the state law and charter language. State law controls the Charter, and Andy said there is not enough time to call for a special election, prepare the ballot and have time to qualify by the May 21 date. If we decide within 90 days, we will have to use our own equipment and pay the election superintendent to set it up. If we do 90-days or longer, we can set up with their same election cycle in November. Andy said the ordinance he provided specifies the suggested dates and times that are most feasible given the requirements. Discussion took place about the dates for qualifying [July 29, 30, and 31] for Mayor position and if needed, qualifying for city council [August 19, 20, and 21]. Andy said he and Misty reviewed all options and specified in the ordinance. If any of the city council members decide to run for mayor, council seat(s) would become vacant and would need a call for special elections and qualifying. This ordinance covers each scenario to allow the public maximum notice of fees, qualifying periods, and the election office maximum notice. The election superintendent has also asked if the city would consider one polling location as opposed to two separate locations and Andy said hopefully, we can reach an agreement within the next couple of years. Andy said a quorum is a requirement to operate the city and vote on items needed for action; therefore, would consist of Mayor Pro Tem and four members of the council. Andy advised that the council discuss with one another and to keep in mind that their political decision will have an impact on how the city conducts business.

Councilman Greer asked what the state law specifies about the number of days between the call of a special election and qualifying and Andy said 29-days. Greer said he understands it would be a time crunch, and asked if we could ask the election superintendent if they could accommodate us in May. Andy said his office and Misty reached out to the Henry County elections office and they directed their county attorney to give confirmation. If the council decides May 21, staff will be responsible for organizing and contracting with someone to hold the election. Andy said the elections office needs 60 days' notice (for printing the ballots); however, if we do as part of the November general election, the law requires the election office to coordinate in its entirety. Greer asked what the procedure would be if the current Mayor Pro Tem could not attend meetings and Andy said the council needs to decide tonight whether to proceed with a May 21 election or with the regular election in November.

Councilman Breedlove said he is ready for a new normal and would like to proceed with the May 21 date versus waiting until November. Andy said this could be a potential trigger for multiple offices on this board and would not allow public the adequate time.

Councilman Boone asked what the stipulations are for appointing an additional Mayor Pro Tem as a [secondary]. Andy said there are no stipulations, the council can appoint a secondary for backup.

Shearouse said he would like to wait until November not only for the community to have time to respond, but also to maintain the appearance of the city.

Tim said there are multiple potential opportunities to have an error in this election process if we had to do it on our own in that short time span. He added that the longer period allows staff to properly inform upcoming applicants of any possible delays should a quorum issue occur. Discussion took place. Andy said the quorum limits our abilities if two councilmembers qualify for Mayor. The ordinance as written specifies the dates Misty and I talked about, which are the three days in July and allowing two weeks between for qualifying of the council [if needed]. Andy said a suggestion was made by a member of the public to change the qualifying dates for the mayor seat to after the first meeting in August [August 6, 7, and 8].

Councilman Boone made the motion to approve the ordinance as written.

Andy clarified this would be for the November 5, 2024, special election with the qualifying as discussed for Mayor [August 6, 7, and 8] and qualifying for the council seat(s), if needed [August 19, 20, and 21].

Councilman Boone made the motion to amend his original motion and made the motion to approve the ordinance with the dates as specified by Andy by approving resolution #24-04-026.

#### **CITY MANAGER'S COMMENTS –**

Tim said the signage at Bill Gardner Parkway and I-75 is now installed. The next phase of ERP 10 training is coming up next week [for two weeks] for Utility Billing and Cashiering. We received a request from Larry Chapman of CRG to do something in honor of the mayor with suggestions of a bronze plaque in front of city hall or a bench. We are planning the official opening of the Veteran's Memorial/Scatter Garden on Memorial Day. We have discussed doing the retreat in July at Brasstown Valley Resort on July 13-16 or July 14-17. We would reschedule the council meeting that would normally be on the 15<sup>th</sup>. The council agreed to the dates July 14-17 for the retreat. Tim said the governor signed the House Bill 1461 regarding annexations and will be on the ballot for November. We will have a special tent on Locust Grove Day for citizens who have questions about anything related to the city and residents will be able to pick up paperwork on the homestead exemption process. Nothing further.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS** -

Ms. Earlene Crump stepped forward to comment. Ms. Crump said she has been a resident of Locust Grove for three years and wanted to make it known to the public she is running for school board District 1. Nothing further.

#### **COUNCIL COMMENTS** –

Councilman Boone thanked everyone who helped with the mayor's funeral and said all the staff came together to make it all possible.

Boone asked if HB 516 passed and Pro Tem Williams said it was approved with the one-mile range and the city is now within the range to run radar.

#### **MAYOR'S COMMENTS** –

Mayor Pro Tem Williams said thanks to everyone for the homegoing celebration to our mayor.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION – PROPERTY ACQUISTION**

#### **PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS** –

#### 1. Amendment to the City of Locust Grove Municipal Code Chapter 5.36 – Special Events –

Daunté stepped forward to comment. Daunté said the council brought up concerns last September about special events and asked if staff would review and address the total number of special events allowed per calendar year. Currently the city allows 14 special events per calendar year. The proposed amendment is to reduce the allowed number to twelve per calendar year and one per month per applicant. In addition, an amendment to allow administrative review and approval of those events that are annual and non-controversial.

Mayor Pro Tem Williams said this is a public hearing and asked for comments from anyone in favor of the request and there were no comments.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from anyone opposed to the request and there were no comments and closed the public hearing.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from the council.

Councilman Greer asked how the Girl Scout events will be affected with the suggested amendment. Daunté said the Girl Scouts got permission from the property owner for their events and discussion took place about TNT fireworks events.

Andy said the amendment suggests one event per month and maximum twelve per calendar year. Daunté said this came up last year with a previous applicant. Andy said there were multiple points from the request last year that brought up concerns and Daunté is making suggestions based on the council's request. Tim said consideration also needs to include public space and private space events which may determine what is allowed at each event location.

Councilman Breedlove commented about the duration of the permit. Andy said the council can place brackets on it or a fee schedule to avoid abuse of the permit. The maximum number of days is 30 consecutive and operate two, 30-day maximum permits per year and charge per day to self-regulate the number of days that people want to get a permit. Daunté said the daily permit fee is [\$22.00] per day and a cap at maximum 30-days [for private property] and cap [public property] to one per month at \$150.00.

Councilman Greer asked if there have been issues in the past related to our discussion. Daunté said within the last five years there were none, only a protest that was held and he clarified not with the current ordinance. Greer has concerns with changing the requirements over one concern.

Daunté said in his opinion we have been implementing the current ordinance very well. This was only suggested based on concerns from the event request from The Artisan Market last year.

Councilman Boone said the concern was the length of time for the permit. Pro Tem Williams suggested a seven-day fee for \$150 and Tim said to also review restrictions between public versus private property. Andy said it is more reasonable to regulate public space. Breedlove said he would like to keep approval/denial for the council with approval from the staff. Daunté said he will revert to the original language. Nothing further.

# 2. Amendment to the City of Locust Grove Municipal Code Chapter 5.40 – Portable Eating Establishments –

Daunté said this amendment specifies reviewing every six months versus every twelve months and Code Enforcement to check. This will require the individual to renew every six months with an inspection as well. We will also keep our database current.

Mayor Pro Tem Williams said this is a public hearing and asked for comments from anyone in favor of the request and there were no comments.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from anyone opposed to the request and there were no comments and closed the public hearing.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from the council.

Councilman Greer asked how many of these establishments are in the city now and Daunté said there are none.

Andy asked if there is a health code advantage to reviewing every six months. Daunté said health inspections are annual and our ordinance has criteria that specifies if in violation, the council can revoke the permit. Tim recommended removing the any other language except for food and beverages only. Nothing further.

#### 3. Amendment to the City of Locust Grove Municipal Code Chapter 5.48 – Yard Sales –

Daunté said this amendment suggests reducing the total number of yard sales permitted per calendar year from five to three for [two consecutive days].

Mayor Pro Tem Williams said this is a public hearing and asked for comments from anyone in favor of the request and there were no comments.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from anyone opposed to the request and there were no comments and closed the public hearing.

Pro Tem Williams asked for comments from the council.

Councilman Breedlove clarified the suggested amendment [from five days to three] and nothing further.

#### CITY OPERATION REPORTS / WORKSHOP DISCUSSION ITEMS -

#### MAIN STREET OPERATIONS - COLLEEN COOK

Ms. Cooks gave an update. It's Auight BBQ restaurant will open in June. The HPC is working on the Local Government status update. Locust Grove Day is April 20, 2024, with 125 vendors and 33 parade entries. The council has a table and tent that will have materials for the public regarding annexations and SPLOST. There will be a special presentation at 1:00 PM on the stage. Nothing further.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONS – CHIEF AUSTIN**

Chief Austin reviewed the monthly report and gave an update total collected in March 2024 was \$93,783. The department completed 216 training hours in March. We had 42 new cases for investigation and cleared 18 of those cases. Chief Austin reviewed the crime analysis report provided and said a man was approached and struck by an individual in Patriots Point subdivision and still ongoing investigation. Ford F-series trucks are being stolen and those cases are still being investigated. The clerk office construction in the lobby of the Public Safety building will begin any day. Nothing further.

#### PUBLIC WORKS - JACK ROSE

Public Works Director Jack Rose said we are continuing with regular maintenance and working on the playground at City Hall. We are continuing with grass cutting and preparing for Locust Grove Day. We moved the gate where Price Drive was closed and please remember the family of Dana Daniel. He was a very hard worker and will be missed.

Mr. Foster gave an update on ongoing projects, the extra lane on Highway 42 and the Bill Gardner Parkway modifications. We ordered bollards and fencing for the Veteran's Memorial. GDOT is still reviewing the plans for the downtown corridor study and GDOT agreed to reduce the speed to 50 miles per hour. Signs have been placed to notify us of the upcoming delays through the end of the month for the traffic signal at Bethlehem Road. The streetlights for the intersection at Indian Creek and Tanger have arrived and will be installed within two weeks. The equipment for the city hall playground is expected to arrive around May 1, 2024. Nothing further.

#### 4. Resolution to create a streetlight district in Oak Ridge Meadows, Phase 1 subdivision -

Mr. Foster said this would include 129 lots with 28 lights. The total would be \$31.34 per lot. Nothing further.

#### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS – DAUNTÉ GIBBS

Mr. Gibbs gave an update that his department has issued a total of 354 permits for 2024 and 43 new house permits. We have issued 58 COs [35 residential / 23 commercial] with 137 business licenses issued so far for 2024.

Councilman Boone asked for an update with Bowery Farms. Daunté said they have not continued thus far. Nothing further.

Councilman Greer asked if the sidewalks to link to Peeksville Road are part of this list. Tim said that will be part of CDBG and said we leveraged enough money to look at some wording of those projects for pedestrian linkages at Grove Road. Nothing further.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 5, CHAPTER 5.36.060, SPECIAL EVENTS; ADDRESSING CONCERNS REGARDING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SPECIAL EVENTS PER CALENDAR YEAR; TO ALLOW ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF NON-CONTROVERSIAL SPECIAL EVENT APPLICATIONS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

## THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Title 5, Chapter 5.36.060 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Locust Grove Georgia is hereby amended in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5.36.060 Special events—Permit—Application—Fee.

- An application shall be submitted for review prior to the issuance of any special events permit. The application must be submitted to the Community Development Department at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the special event. Upon completion of the review of the request, the community development director, or designee, shall refer only those applications deemed potentially controversial to the mayor and council for approval or denial. Otherwise, Special Event application approval or denial shall be completed administratively. Upon the approval of the application by the Community Development Director or designee, or the mayor and council, the Community Development Director or designee shall issue the special event permit. The special event permit must be present on the site of the special event for the duration of the special event.
- 1. The application for a special events permit shall include the following information:
  - a. Applicant's name, address, phone number, and email address.
  - b. Location of the special event.
  - c. Name and phone number of onsite contact who will be onsite for the duration of the special event.
  - d. Description of the nature of the special event.
  - e. Identify sponsors and/or merchants participating in the event.
  - f. Identify types of goods to be sold, additional permits may be required for portable eating establishments or for a transient dealer license.
  - g. Duration of the special event, including set up and take down.

- h. Description of music/entertainment.
- i. Written permission from the property owner.
- j. Legible copy of the applicant's driver's license.
- k. For special events involving parades, marches, running or cycling along public streets, a copy of the proposed route.
- B. Special events that occur in the public right-of-way must adhere to the requirements below, in addition to those requirements listed in section 5.36.060(A).
- 1. Locations for donation collections in the public right-of-way shall be limited to the following areas:
  - a. On the southbound off-ramp of Interstate 75 South at Bill Gardner Parkway.
  - b. Within one hundred feet of the intersection of Bill Gardner Parkway and Market Place Boulevard.
  - c. Within one hundred feet of the intersection of State Route 42 and Market Place Boulevard.
  - d. Within one hundred feet of the intersection Tanger Boulevard and Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard.
- 2. No one under the age of eighteen years of age shall participate in a special event in the public right-of-way without meeting the following adult supervision requirement:
  - a. Any participants between ages of thirteen and seventeen shall require one adult for every four participants in that age group.
  - b. Any participants between ages of ten and twelve shall require one adult for every two participants in that age group.
  - c. Any participants under ten years of age shall require one adult for every one participant in that age group.
- 3. All participants in the special event occurring in the public right-of-way shall be required to wear high-visibility safety apparel for the duration of the special event.
- C. At the time of filing the application, a fee of one hundred fifty dollars shall be paid to the community development director to cover the cost of investigating the facts stated in the application. The application fee may be waived in whole or in part by the mayor and council.

- D. Approved Special Events located on public property shall be limited to twelve (12) special events per calendar year, not to exceed three (3) consecutive days per month. Special events located on public property shall be assessed the special event permit base fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for a one-day event up to \$250.00 for a 3-day special event. Those organizations having 501c3 non-profit status may be considered exempt from the special event permit fee if current 501c3 status documentation is provided to the Community Development Department. Special events in partnership with and sanctioned by a board or committee established by the City of Locust Grove (Events Committee, Downtown Development Authority/Main Street, Historic Preservation Commission) shall be exempt from the calendar year limitation of this section. Special events located on private property are also exempt from the calendar year limitation of this section but shall not exceed 60 days total per calendar year. Special events located on private property shall pay a daily permit fee calculated at the rate of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day specified on the applicant's special event application filed with the City of Locust Grove Community Development Department.
- E. The Community Development Director or their designee, and or the mayor and council may impose conditions of the approval of the special events permit including, but not limited to, required sanitation and clean-up measures, security measures or bond to guarantee performance of the condition(s).

SECTION 2. Codification. This ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

#### SECTION 3. Severability.

A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable, and constitutional.

B. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, every section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of Ordinance.

C. In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality, or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by

law, all remaining Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable and of full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Repeal of Conflicting Provision. Except as otherwise provided herein, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove.

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS

**SECTION 1.** Title 5, Chapter 5.48.020 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Locust Grove Georgia is hereby amended in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

#### 5.48.020 Permit required—License fee required when.

- A. Any person conducting a yard sale, garage sale or other such sale, at their residence in the city, or participating in a yard sale, garage sale or other such sale in the city, shall obtain a permit from the clerk of the city prior to holding such sale. Said permit shall not exceed two consecutive days.
- B. Said resident is authorized to conduct three (3) sales per calendar year without payment of a fee. Additional sales shall be allowed during a calendar year and the person requesting permission to conduct such sale shall pay a license fee of twenty-five dollars per sale.
- C. No permits shall be issued to any person that is not a resident of the city.
- D. Any civic, church or nonprofit organization conducting a yard sale, garage sale or other such sale within the city shall obtain a permit from the clerk of the city prior to the holding of such sale.

**SECTION 2.** Codification. This ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

#### **SECTION 3. Severability.**

A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable, and constitutional.

B. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the City Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other Section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of Ordinance.

C. In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality, or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable and of full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Repeal of Conflicting Provision. Except as otherwise provided herein, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 5, CHAPTER 5.40.020, PORTABLE EATING ESTABLISHMENTS, TO PROVIDE CLARIFICATION TO THE DEFINITION OF PORTABLE EATING ESTABLISHMENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE HEREBY ORDAINS

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Title 5, Chapter 5.40.020 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Locust Grove Georgia is hereby amended in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5.40.020 Definitions.

"Food, beverages, goods or merchandise" means and includes but shall not be limited to fruit, vegetables, farm products or provisions, dairy products, fish, game, poultry, meat, plants, flowers, artwork, cosmetics and beauty aides, health products, food of any kind whether or not for immediate consumption and confections.

"Motor vehicle" means any vehicle used for the displaying, storing, or transporting of articles for sale by a vendor which is required to be licensed and registered by the State Department of Motor Vehicles. The term is to include trailers, trucks and automobiles.

"Person or individual" means any person including any employee or agency of any group of individuals, partnerships, corporations.

"Portable eating establishment" means a temporary mobile structure capable of being relocated in its entirety, on wheels with axles or in any other manner and which does not sit upon a foundation designed for the establishment of a permanent structure, limited to occupational tax licensing that must be renewed every six (6) months.

"Public space" means and includes all city owned parks and city owned property within street rights-of-way.

"Public way" means all areas legally open to public use such as public streets, sidewalks, roadways, highways, parkways, alleys, parks, as well as the interior and areas surrounding public buildings.

"Push carts" means any wheeled vehicle designed for carrying property and for being pushed by a person without the assistance of a motor or motor vehicle.

"Sidewalk" means all areas legally open to the public used as a pedestrian public way between the curb line and the legal building line.

"Special event" means any occasion including, but not limited to fairs, shows, exhibitions, citywide celebrations, festivals, etc., within a specifically defined area of the city for a period of time not to exceed five days.

"Stand" means any newsstand, table, bench, booth, rack, handcart, pushcart, portable eating establishments or any other fixture or device which is used for the display, storage, or transportation of articles offered for sale by a vendor.

"Street" means all that area legally open to the public used as public streets and sidewalks, roadways, highways, parkways.

"Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which a person or property may be transported or drawn upon a street or sidewalk, including, but not limited to, devices moved by human power.

"Vendor" means any person traveling by foot, wagon, motor vehicle, vehicle or any other type of conveyance from street to street conveying or transporting food, beverages, goods or merchandise and offering or exposing them for sale or making sales and delivering articles to the purchasers; or who, without traveling from place to place, exhibits, displays, sells or offers for sale such products from a wagon, handcart, pushcart, motor vehicle, vehicle, portable eating stand, conveyance or from his person while on the public ways of the city or other places. A "vendor" also includes any street vendor, hawker, huckster, itinerant merchant or transient vendor.

**SECTION 2.** Codification. This ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

#### **SECTION 3. Severability.**

A. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable, and constitutional.

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unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable and of full force and effect.

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<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Council of the City of Locust Grove.

The City's Street Light Tax District Ordinance permits the Council to create streetlight districts by resolution. The City will pay the electricity usage fees on the lights each month then be reimbursed annually for these fees by way of an annual fees that is added to each property tax statement of the lots located within the streetlight district plus reimbursement for administrative costs.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Locust Grove, Georgia ("City") adopted Article II, Chapter 3.10 ("Chapter") entitled "Street Light Tax Districts"; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Chapter is to provide the City with a procedure for the installation, maintenance and operation of street lights in certain public rights-of-way in the City of Locust Grove and for the promotion of health, safety, prosperity and general welfare of the citizens of Locust Grove; and,

WHEREAS, Chris Wilson of Forestar (USA) Real Estate Group ("Owner") submitted an Application for Special Tax District – Street Lighting and a Petition for Special Tax District – Street Lighting ("Application") on March 7, 2023 attached as Exhibit "A"; and,

WHEREAS, the Application indicates support from one-hundred percent (100%) of the property owners in Bridle Creek, Phase 2-B, subdivision in accordance with the Chapter; and,

WHEREAS, the Owner submitted a copy of the Central Georgia Electric Membership Corporation Underground Wiring / Outdoor Lighting Agreement for Bridle Creek, Phase 2-B subdivision ("Request") outlining the costs, quantities, locations, terms and conditions associated with the Request attached as Exhibit "B"; and,

WHEREAS, the City agrees to pay the monthly streetlight fee of \$126.75 (\$1,521 annually) to Central Georgia EMC and to be reimbursed for such payments by way of assessments imposed upon all property owners within this subdivision in the amount of \$28.67 (includes a 15% administrative fee) per lot annually; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Mayor and City Council ("Council") reviewed the Application and Request during a workshop meeting held on February 19, 2024; and,

A contribution in aid of construction shall be paid in advance for the footage in excess of the base allowance.

### Discussion:

The City has identified approximately 350 linear feet of streambank along Wolf Creek at the Grove Road crossing that is in need of stabilization due to the cumulative effects of erosion caused by upstream developments. Portions of the unstable streambank lie in close proximity to single-family dwellings that may become compromised if steps are not taken to stabilize the banks.

In April 2024, the City accepted a written report by WSP, the City's on-call engineering firm, containing the following alternative recommendation for restoring the Wolf Creek stream bank where erosion has destabilized the embankment.

<u>Targeted stabilization</u> – a method to stabilize areas identified as being in need of support with riprap with minimal disturbance to healthy mature vegetation and areas already stabilized through natural processes.

With the acceptance of the recommendation by WSP, Staff then directed WSP to prepare a professional service proposal for engineering design and permitting based on the alternative recommendation chosen by the Council ("Proposal"). The Proposal includes the following services:

- Topographic survey of the project area
- Tree survey
- Complete design package for permitting and construction
  - o 90% design drawings for City's review and comment
  - o Preparation of permitting packages
  - o 100% design drawings for approval and permitting by regulating agencies
- Construction Estimate
- Planting plan
- Hydrology modeling and methodology to disperse erosive energy
- Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan as required by GSWCC
- Preparation of a buffer variance application package for impacts to the 25-foot state waters buffer
- Natural Resources study as required by the US Army Corps of Engineers in conjunction with a Section 404 Nationwide Permit 13 for Bank Stabilization.

WSP USA Environment & Infrastructure Inc. (WSP) is pleased to provide this proposal for professional services to prepare design drawings and secure permits for stream restoration for one segment of Wolf Creek. The following sections outline our understanding of the project, proposed scope of services, anticipated schedule, fee estimate, and the terms and conditions for these services.

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND


WSP prepared preliminary stream assessments for Wolf Creek located between the parcels at 230 and 262 Grove Road, upstream of Skyland Lake. The stream segment of interest extends approximately 350 linear feet downstream from Grove Road. The recommendation for this stream segment stabilization was provided in a report dated March 15, 2024. The city council voted and accepted the recommendation (Alternative 1) during their Regular Meeting on April 1, 2024.

#### 2.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

#### Task 1: Topography Survey

Our subcontractor Patriot Surveying & Infrastructure will perform a topography survey for approximately 350 linear feet of Wolf Creek, located downstream from Grove Road, running towards Skyland Lake. Topography survey will include:

- Upstream and downstream inverts of the culverts under Grove Road, centerline, and edge of pavement of Grove Road at the culvert
- 1-foot topography through the project reach
- Elevations and locations for top of bank, bottom of bank, thalweg (low point), and any slope breaks in section
- Detail for each pool or point of slower, deeper water, capture water surface and pool center (or deepest point)



- Increased point density as needed to fully characterize features 2, 3, 5 and 6 and the channel in the immediate vicinity of these features as shown on the above figure
- Trees 4" diameter or larger at chest height and within 25 feet of the stream bank; trees species such as hardwood, pine, or softwood will be noted on the survey
- A cross-section roughly 150 feet upstream of Grove Road (Sta -1+50), and downstream of the
  project reach (downstream of the brush pile identified on Exhibit 1, Sta 4+100) to include top of
  bank, bottom of bank and thalweg
- Environmental flagging found within the survey limits.

WSP assumes that the City will assist with property owners' notification to acquire permission for site access along both the project area and referenced reach as needed. WSP also assumes that all field work will be collected by a team of two within one day.

#### Task 2: Preparation of Streambank Restoration Design and Drawings

WSP will prepare a design package including a plan set for permitting with required construction, specifications listed on the drawings., An engineer's opinion of probable construction costs for stream stabilization will be provided. The plan set will include a planting plan for the stabilized stream banks and for reestablishing the riparian vegetation where needed with a focus on using native species.

The design process will include an evaluation and modelling of the watershed hydrology, channel hydraulics, stream bank shear stress and riprap stability for energy dissipation. Methods and results from the evaluation of will be summarized in a brief design report.

As part of the design plan set, a Georgia Soil and Water Conservation Commission (GSWCC) Certified Level II Design Engineer will prepare and sign a phased erosion and sedimentation control

plan as required by the Georgia Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES).

We will prepare and submit a 90% design package for the City review and initiate the Section 404 and Stream Buffer Variance discussions. The design package will include general notes, proposed grading plan, erosion and sedimentation control plans, streambank details and sections needed to communicate the scope of the project to the City and permitting agencies, and to quantify the impacts to jurisdictional waters. The 90% plan will be sufficient for contractor bidding, and submission of environmental permits.

A 100% Issued for Construction (IFC) set will be prepared and will incorporate additional edits requested by the City and permitting agencies, if any. It is assumed that the City will work with the land owner(s) to obtain construction easements and all necessary agreements for the work shown on the final design plans.

#### Task 3 Environmental Permitting

#### Task 3.1 Stream Buffer Variance

WSP team will prepare the 25-foot buffer application package for signature by the City representative, based on the Erosion, Sedimentation and Pollution Control Plan, prepared in Task 2. Buffer variance package will include complete application form and required impact checklist items in accordance with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Environmental Protection Division (EPD) current requirements. WSP will submit the buffer encroachment application package to EPD for review. When EPD publishes the Public Notice, our team will assist the City to respond to public comments in order to obtain EPD approval for the buffer encroachment.

#### Task 3.2 Land Development Clearing and Grading Permit

The total disturbed area will be less than 1 acre such that an NPDES permit will not be required. However, the project is within 200 feet of a Water of the State and subject to the Georgia Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act requiring a land disturbance permit from Locust Grove as the Local Issuing Authority and a phased erosion and sedimentation control plan as specified by the NPDES checklist.

We will complete land disturbance permit documents and submit to the City for review and approval.

#### Task 3.3 Section 404 Nationwide Permit 13 for Bank Stabilization

In support for permitting under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act Section 404, a WSPs field scientist will conduct a natural resource survey to identify wetlands and jurisdictional waters, a survey for threatened and endangered species, and survey for cultural resources within the project reach.

WSP will communicate with the USACE district engineer regarding the most appropriate method for obtaining a Section 404 permit. At this time, we anticipate coverage under Nationwide Permit 13 for Bank Stabilization. A pre-construction notice (PCN) for coverage may

not be necessary depending on the final scope of the project; however, for cost and schedule purposes we have assumed that a PCN will be prepared and submitted.

Provided impacts to jurisdictional waters of the US are below the threshold values of 1/10 acres of wetlands and 3/100 acres of stream bed, compensatory mitigation will not be required. The restoration of the riparian areas may be sufficient for mitigation if it is found to be needed.

#### Task 4 Project Management and Administration

Time has been included for project set-up and kick-off, one coordination meeting to discuss the project and present final deliverables.

Time for project management, internal and external coordination, and communications is included in this task. A preliminary schedule is included with this proposal and as needed, will be revised after receipt of NTP.

#### 3.0 EXCEPTIONS

In addition to the foregoing services being performed, the following items are excluded from the described scope but can be provided upon request:

- Property owner notification, communication, or coordination
- Boundary survey and SUE investigation work
- Easement acquisitions (construction or permanent)
- In-person meeting(s)
- Other service that are not included in the described tasks
- At this time, we assume the cultural heritage survey and threatened and endangered species survey will be performed by a desktop search only. If our archeologist or scientist identifies a potential for historic artifacts or endangered species on site, a field investigation will be necessary at an additional cost.
- We assume that Locust Grove will be the named permittee for all permits obtained and will pay all permit application and plan review fees, tree recompense, bonds, and mitigation costs. We do not anticipate a need for either bonding or mitigation currently for this project.
- Bid support and construction administration services are excluded.
